
Pupil Christmas Dinner

Wreath Laying and Remembrance

Mr McAllister and Mrs Norris accompanied Melah, Kyrin and Jake, three of our P7 pupils, as they laid the wreath on behalf of the Governors, Staff and Pupils of Fairview Primary School at the Remembrance Day Service in Ballyclare War Memorial Park last Sunday. Their tribute reminds us all to cherish and remember the sacrifices made for our freedom.

Primary 6 visited Ballyclare's War Memorial Park, as part of their Forest Schools programme, to commemorate the local men and women who had lost their lives in conflict. We looked at all the beautiful poppies and learnt about how significant they were. We also looked at all the names on the memorials and discussed some key questions whilst there. We have been studying World War 2 as our topic, so it was very interesting to find out about some of the soldiers and pilots who had sadly lost their lives during it - especially learning about how we are very close to the Second World War Royal Air Force Crash sites, where eleven aircrew lost their lives in two separate aeroplane crashes.

Primary 6 Visit to NI War Memorial Museum

Last week our P6 boys and girls paid a visit to Northern Ireland War Memorial Museum in Belfast to further their learning about World War 2. We learned lots of new, interesting information about how Belfast was affected by the war, especially during the Blitz. We even got to try on some uniforms worn by WW2 soldiers, medics and pilots!!
