Between both teams, Fairview tallied up an incredible 41 goals! The most important outcome of the day was how much the girls enjoyed themselves; this is what sport is all about!



Ballyclare and District Football Tournament

On Wednesday, the senior football team walked the short distance to the 3G pitch at Dixon Park to participate in the second Ballyclare and District 7-a-side football tournament.

Our first game was against Ballyclare PS. The Fairview boys started strongly and saw shots from Aiden Mouatekef and Jude Forsythe go narrowly wide early on. Ballyclare had their own chances to open the scoring and kept the defensive duo of Hunter Moore and Aaron Hawe on their toes. Goalkeeper Alexander Brown made an excellent one handed save from a Ballyclare strike to maintain the deadlock. Teddy McGrath saw an effort well saved at the near post after turning his marker while Aiden was unlucky to see his shot go wide when through on goal. However, it was Aiden who broke the deadlock with 5 minutes to go. A long ball up from Alexander was controlled perfectly, sidestepping the defender before slotting into the bottom corner to make it 1-0. Ballyclare pushed hard for an equaliser but Fairview defended brilliantly. With just a minute left on the clock, Aiden doubled the lead and secured the points. This time he received the ball from Thomas McNeilly on the left before spinning and poking the ball between the defenders legs to make the final score 2-0.

Our second game was against Templepatick PS and the Fairview boys started brightly. This time we took the lead early on thanks to Teddy McGrath. After receiving the ball on the right from Jude Forsythe, Teddy sidestepped neatly past two defenders before striking the ball confidently into the bottom left hand corner of the goal, past the outstretched hand of the Templepatrick keeper to make it 1-0. As expected, this fired Templepatrick into action and they pushed hard for a goal of their own. Alexander Brown was kept busy and made a number of super saves and interceptions while Aaron Hawe and Hunter Moore did their best to stop the attacks at source. Fairview had chances to increase their lead too with Aiden seeing the best of these chances; this time his touch and turn let him down and gave the defender time to recover and make the block. Thomas McNeilly had two shots saved while both Teddy McGrath and Jude Forsythe saw their efforts go high and wide respectfully. As it looked like Fairview would hold on for the win Templepatrick had one last chance and they made it count. A long ball sent goalward from a pass-in found the back of the net after taking an unlucky defection from a Fairview player to make the final score 1-1.

Game three was against Ballynure PS. Again, Fairview opened the scoring early on through Aiden Mouatekef who poked the ball home after super build up work from Thomas McNeilly on the left. Teddy McGrath made it 2-0 soon after, smashing the ball into the roof of the net past the keeper after beating his defender. Ballynure pushed hard for a goal of their own but this time it was Charlie Cross and Jude McQueston who were partnered in defence and able to stop the attacks. It was Jude McQueston who scored Fairview's third goal after Jude Forsythe saw his initial shot saved. Aiden Mouatekef made it 4-0 receiving the ball from Jude Forsythe before turning and shooting past the keeper and into the back of the net. As Fairview pushed hard to increase their goal tally, Ballynure also had chances and eventually managed to skip past the defender before sliding the ball past Alexander in goal to make it 4-1. However, Fairview did increase the lead again soon after. This time it was Charlie Cross who scored his first goal of the year with a well taken strike to make it 5-1. Teddy McGrath beat the keeper at the near post to score his second of the game before Jude McQueston 'kneed' the ball into the roof of the net to also score his second of the game and make the final score 7-1.
